**Minutes of the Eighth Meeting of the Academic Council Held  
on 28.07.2001 at 11.00 a.m.**

At the outset, the Council welcomed Prof. Yogesh Singh, Dean, School of  
Information Technology, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University as a new member  
of the Academic Council. Thereafter, item-wise discussions were held and the decisions  
on the various items of the agenda are summarized below:-

**Item No. 8.1: To confirm the minutes of 7<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic  
Council held on 07.03.2001**

The minutes of the 7<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council which had been  
circulated vide letter dated 16.03.2001, were confirmed.

**Item No. 8.2: Action Taken Report**

The members of the Academic Council noted the action taken on various  
resolutions of the 7<sup>th</sup> meeting and accepted the Action Taken Report.

**Item No. 8.3: To approve the scheme of examination and syllabus of  
various programmes being run in the University Schools of  
Studies and in the affiliated institutions.**

The Academic Council approved the syllabus and examination scheme of the  
following programmes offered in the University Schools of Studies and in the affiliated  
institutions for implementation from the academic session 2001-2002:-

Dean (Acad.) informed the members that the curriculum and examination scheme of Post Graduate Diploma in Information Technology (PGDIT) programme proposed to be placed on the table for consideration and approval of the Council. As the same is proposed to be introduced from this academic session 2001-2002, the Council authorised the Vice-Chancellor to approve the syllabus and examination scheme of the programme. The Council also authorized the Vice-Chancellor to approve any changes/modifications required in the curricula of the said courses.

Further members expressed their concern regarding duration of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) programme which at present is of one year duration including "teaching practice" in schools. Members were of the opinion that B.Ed. programme should be at least one and half year or two years duration including teaching practice in schools. Council therefore, suggested that University may take up the matter with NCTE in this regard.

**Item No. 8.4: To approve the ordinances relating to Conduct and Evaluation of University Examinations.**

The Council deliberated the proposed ordinances relating to conduct and evaluation of University Examinations. The members suggested deletion of the word "Controller" in para-5 at page-7, i.e., Controller of Examination shall be authorized to add

...approved the suggestion for adoption in the ordinances.

...ifications, the Council approved the following ordinances:-

Ordinance relating to the Conduct and Evaluation of Examinations for all programmes leading to Bachelor's degrees following the annual system of examination (other than programmes for which a separate ordinance is notified)

Ordinance relating to the Conduct and Evaluation of Examinations for all programmes leading to Bachelor's/Master's Degrees and undergraduate/post graduate diplomas following semester system (other than the programmes for which a separate ordinance is notified).

Dean (Acad.) apprised the members that an ordinance for Ph.D. programmes was drafted in a similar format. To help speedy completion of this work the Council asked the Vice-Chancellor to approve this ordinance after it is finalised.

**Item No. 8.5: Status of admissions to various programmes offered in the University Schools of Studies and the affiliated institutions for the session 2001-2002.**

The Vice-Chancellor apprised the members that response for admissions during academic year was almost 25% to 30% more as compared to the last year for all the programmes offered by the University Schools of Studies and the affiliated institutions. Members noted the overwhelming response for the admissions. After a detailed deliberation of the demand for certain programmes and their necessity and the employment market, the Council made the following recommendations:-

Mass Communication programme at Master's level may be considered by the University to be introduced in the University School of Studies, as there is an exponential rise in demand for trained media professionals, particularly in electronic and web-based media.



that A students should be given opportunity for direct admission in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of MCA programme and similarly BBA passed out students be considered for direct admission in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of MBA programme. The Council decided that when the lateral entry to BCA and BBA is approved, then only the professional programme at under graduate level will be more meaningful and useful in the country. It was resolved by the Council that the University may take up the matter with AICTE in this regard for consideration and approval of lateral entry for BCA and BBA passed out students in the MCA and MBA programmes respectively.

Further, as approval of AICTE and State Govt. has been accorded to some new institutions for conducting MCA programme and also the intake for MCA programme in some institutions has been enhanced and all these additional seats will be filled-up during second counselling to be held in the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of August, 2001, there will be some reshuffling of students already admitted in MCA programme during the first counselling. In view of this, it was decided that the classes for MCA programme would commence from 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2001 instead of 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2001.

**Item No.8.6: Proposal for creation of 18 posts of lecturers in the University Schools of Studies**

The Council approved the creation of the proposed additional 18 posts of lecturers in various programmes in the University Schools of Studies.

**Sharing of Resources:**


Sharing of resources among affiliated colleges was discussed in detail. The Chancellor suggested that two or more colleges may pool together for arranging common classes, expert lectures for selected topics, lab work, project work, etc. Prof. P. Goyal; Dean, School of Management Studies in the University and Prof. S.N. Dwari, Director, Delhi Institute of Advanced Studies were requested to work out

to consider, discuss, and modify the report submitted by them on the subject  
of the Council.

**Meeting of institutions/online studies:**

After deliberation, it was decided that the University may take up the task of  
opening of its institutions and organizing online studies for institutions conducting  
and BCA programmes. Dr. Yogesh Singh, Dean, School of Information  
Technology was requested to work out the details in consultation with Dr. Om Vikas, Sr.  
Department of Electronics, Government of India.
